Some 600 marches were held that day in cities across the country on women's issues, including the hub of the event in Washington, D.C.

In Atlanta, some 60,000 people showed, in Chicago police turned people away because of the enormous crowd.

But, regardless of the turnout, women united across this country, and their voices were heard, loudly and clearly.

Also a former Cleveland schools biology teacher who trained for 17 years at the Call and Post Newspaper, Coleman said she was inspired by the event.

She urged the federal government to bring in more resources to the largely Black city of Cleveland and to support the city's economic development.
